11 Students Participated in the Language Studying Tour to Germany!

The students took classes about German language and culture on weekdays at Freiburg University. On weekends, they enjoyed field trips to Switzerland and so on. These are the comments from students who participated in this tour.

Freiburg was a city that I wanted to walk around forever. The buildings were so different from Japanese ones and the center of the city was closed to car traffic. I was so excited about seeing all the buildings, people walking on pedestrian roadways, local markets, children floating a boat on a small waterway and all the new sights. The German classes focused on listening and I tried to learn so hard in order to use them in real situations. I had such a healthy life I hardly had in Japan! (Dept. of Electrical and Electronic Engineering: Sophomore, Natsumi KURIYAMA)

I learned many things through this studying tour. People in Germany had different ways to communicate and they were friendly even when we met for the first time. Speaking in German was difficult but I could communicate with them also in English. I was very happy about it and it became confident in studying English in the future. I will keep studying English and German hard. (Study of Mechanical, Civil and Environmental Engineering: Freshman Ryota FUKUMOTO)

It was my first time to visit Europe in my life. Taking German classes and living in Germany for three weeks made me able to speak daily conversation or order something when shopping. I found that I could live in the country where I did not know their language. I went to visit Neuschwanstein Castle which is a world heritage site. I also visited France and Switzerland. I really enjoyed myself in Germany. I was worried a little before the tour, but Prof. Natalie was kind and helped me every time I had troubles. I could make foreign friends and keep communicating with them through "Facebook" and "chat" applications. German food was delicious. White sausages, carbonara pasta-sauce and kebab were so good. That 3 weeks in Germany was long in one way and short in another way. I did not have a feeling of reality before visiting and now I feel like it was a dream. In Germany, I had a hard time with differences of culture and language at first, but I came to enjoy the differences and would like to know more about that. I had a lecture about environmental policy and it was very deeply impressive. I will make use of this experience and I definitely would like to visit Germany, again. I could not make myself understood in Germany at first, but I came to be able to communicate a little in German at last. I visited a Mercedes museum and a Porsche museum. It was my first time to go abroad. I was anxious about staying in Germany for 3 weeks, however people were very kind and I enjoyed myself very much. All of the scenery was much more beautiful and moving than I saw in the pictures and I expected. I also enjoyed many varieties of German food such as bread, sausages and pasta. I found other customs interesting too, that they keep the door open except for sleeping and changing, in order to consider each other in the family.
