

International "C" Hour—A Presentation on "Traveling in Antarctica at 5 mph"

In our second International "C" Hour on 9 June Ryo Kusaka, the first KIT graduate student who joined an Antarctic observation team, told

us about his incredible journey to Antarctica and presented amazing photographs. After a long and often rather boring journey on planes and the ice breaker *Shirase*, Ryo Kusaka arrived after 1 month in the Antarctica. There he and the observation team traveled 1000 km one-way on the conti-



nent by snowmobile. They stayed at the Dome Fuji Station, where one of the tasks was to take ice core samples for research purposes. Before returning to the ship, the observation team made a stop at the Showa Station where they enjoyed drinks in the bar and a nice hot bath (ofuro) – for the first time after several weeks. Then it was time to return to the ship and endure another long journey homeward – but not without getting the chance to see the beautiful Southern lights. After the presentation there was time for Q&A and all participants were deeply interested in more details of the trip. They were impressed by Ryo Kusaka's experiences and fascinated by the beautiful scenery and breathtaking photographs.

The 49th KIT Festival

On the weekend of 18-19 June the 49th annual KIT Festival was held. After a rainy start, the clouds cleared and the participants, KIT students, faculty, staff and Kitami citizens, were able to enjoy a wonderful and sunny time. Each year the festival gives the students the opportunity to introduce their lab and research to friends, family and other people. Outside, in front of the main building, participants had a great time watching various stage performances and playing games. And like the years before, thanks to the many international students, the festival had again a very international touch. Various food booths offered Japanese and international cuisine, such as Japanese yakiniku, okonomiyaki, Korean chijimi, Chinese gyoza, Taiwanese Tapioka milk tea, Vietnamese noodle soup—to mention just a small number. One main attraction for international students during the KIT Festival was the Japanese cultural corner with three events. Here the students could learn Japanese flower arrangement (ikebana), experience a Japanese tea ceremony and wear beautiful Japanese kimono. But this time the festival also had a more serious note in the light of the Tohoku earthquake disaster. Students collected money which has been donated to the victims of the Tohoku earthquake and tsunami area.





Plant Study and Hiking Tour at Shinrin-Park

On 25 June Prof. Yamagishi, former Director of the International Center, and important figure to the international students at the Center, took a group of 26 students on a hiking tour to Shinrin-Park to learn about plants in this region. The trip was kindly supported by the Kitami East Rotary Club of which 5 members joined the tour as well. After a 1-hour bus ride the group arrived at Shinrin-Park where the Kitami East Rotary Club first presented their donation for the event. Then Prof. Yamagishi started the tour by explaining about the various plants along the way. Students not only enjoyed listening to the explanations, but even got the chance to taste some of the plants and learn how to pipe on a blade of grass. After the hiking tour everyone enjoyed the delicious Genghis Khan BBQ. Full and satisfied the spontaneous idea came up to drive a few meters ahead and visit the beach of the Okhotsk Sea. After walking through the beautiful green of the woods and plants, the contrast to the sand and dark blue water left another wonderful impression on the group. Everyone had a marvelous time, and on the way back on the bus, the singing voices of the international students confirmed this.
